

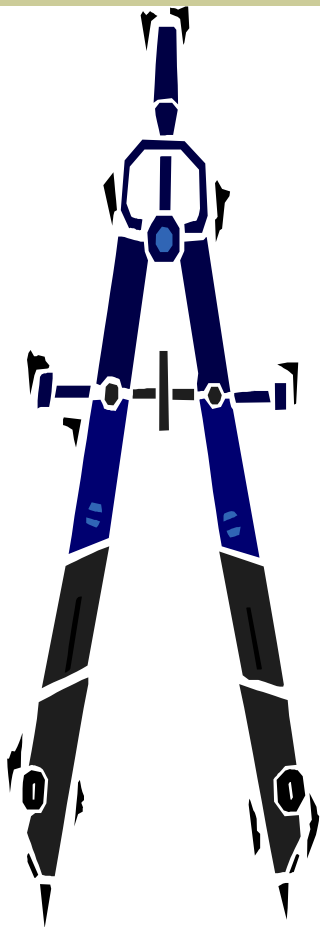

**Architecture Studies Library***University Libraries—University of Nevada, Las Vegas***ASL Installs New Computers!**

Over the summer, the Architecture Studies Library (ASL) staff worked diligently with the University Libraries Systems staff to install over 30 new computers for public use.

Many improvements will be noticeable with our new Gateway E series workstations. Each terminal is equipped with a 3.06 GHz Pentium 4 processor, 1 GB of memory (RAM), a 40 GB hard drive, floppy drive, a 750MB Zip drive [**not compatible with 100MB Zip disks**], and CD-RW/DVD combo drive (which allows reading and writing CDs and reading DVDs). Additionally, each computer will have a 17" flat

panel monitor. All computers will be running the Windows XP Professional operating system. Headphone jacks are also located on the front of each machine.

We've also installed a new authentication/login system on all our computers. The login box will ask for your username and password. Your username is your library barcode. Your password is the last 4 digits of your social security number. You may change your password by visiting the ASL service desk.

Stop by the ASL service desk if you are having any trouble with your computer or library card. ■

ASL @ a glance

- The ASL Staff performed 18,758 patron assistance functions [checking out items, answering reference questions, etc.] during the 2002-2003 fiscal year, up 13% from the year before.
- Use of the ASL's website increased 154% last fiscal year—registering over ONE MILLION hits.
- ASL Staff instructed 878 patrons during 37 instruction sessions.
- Over 1,500 items were added to the ASL's stacks collections last year—a growth rate of 8%.



Beware ZIP Disk Users!

The ASL's new computers come equipped with a 750 mb ZIP drive. These drives are **NOT COMPATIBLE** with 100 mb ZIP disks. Please be cautious when creating large documents! As an alternative, all computers are now equipped with CD-R drives, so you may burn your files to a CD.
