# Sticker Maker Guide

"I only have my image and no clue what to do!"

#### **Before You Start**

- Ensure your image is saved on your computer or accessible via:
  - Google Drive
  - USB flash drive
  - Attached in an email

### Setting Up Your File in Adobe Illustrator

- 1. Open Adobe Illustrator 🔼
  - 1. Select library computers and <u>computers in one of these</u> <u>labs</u> provide Adobe Creative Cloud.
- 2. Sign in using your ACE account.
- 3. Create a New Document.
  - 1. Select New File from the top-left menu.
  - 2. Select the following the **New Document** window:
    - On the right side, change the **Units** from Points to **Inches**.
    - Set Width to 18 inches.
    - Set Height to 12 inches.
  - 3. Select Create.
- 4. Place your image.
  - 1. Go to File  $\rightarrow$  Place.
  - 2. Select the image file from your computer.
  - 3. Click and drag on the blank page to position your image.
- 5. Resize your image (if needed)
  - 1. If the image is not the correct size:
    - Select the image.
    - Hold Shift (to keep proportions) and drag a corner handle to resize.

## 3 Ways of Cutting

Red = cut line

Anything outside the lines will be cut off.



1: Shape Tool Most simple!

Can be a:

- rectangle
- circle
- oval
- hexagon
- star



2: Pen Tool
Some coordination

required.

You trace over the design.

Has a little learning curve.



3: Image Trace

Most number of steps.

May not work for some designs.

Works best if design already has a border or is transparent.

Note: the line color will be changed later. Red is only used here for demonstration.


### **Making Cut Lines**

The most important but also complicated part.



### Using the Shape Tool

- 1. On the left toolbar, select the **Rectangle** Tool.
  - To choose a different shape (like an ellipse or polygon), right-click on the Rectangle Tool to see more shape options.



- 2. Click and drag over your design to draw the shape.
  - Hold Shift while dragging to keep the shape perfectly proportioned (e.g., a perfect square or circle).
- 3. When the shape looks the way you want, release the mouse.
- 4. To make adjustments:
  - Select the Selection Tool (the black arrow at the top of the left toolbar).
  - Click and drag the edges or corners of the shape to resize or reposition it.
- 5. Continue to Page 6.






### Using the Pen Tool

- 1. On the left toolbar, select the **Curvature Tool** (curvy line).
- 2. In the right toolbar, select the Fill Color square.
  - Select the red slash icon to remove the fill so the picture is fully visible.
- 3. Use the **Curvature Tool** to create points by clicking along the edge of the image.
  - o Closer points = more accurate outline.
- 4. When back at the starting point, click again to close the shape.
- 5. To adjust the shape:
  - Select the Direct Selection Tool (white arrow) from the left toolbar.
  - Click and drag points to reposition or fine-tune the outline.
- 6. To straighten a section of the line:
  - Switch back to the Curvature Tool.
    - o Hold Alt and click the points you want to straighten.





7. Continue to Page 6.








#### Using the Image Trace Tool

- 1. Select your image.
  - o Copy (Ctrl + C) and Paste in Place (Ctrl + Shift + V).
- 2. Select the top image.
  - In the Properties panel, under Quick Actions, select Image Trace.
  - From the Image Trace options, choose Silhouettes.
  - This converts the image into a solid shape.



- 3. Fine-tune the shape in the **Image Trace** pop-up menu:
  - If the settings aren't open, select the icon next to the dropdown menu (right side panel).



- 4. Adjust the Threshold slider until the shape looks correct.
  - Once you're happy with the shape, select Expand.
- 5. To smooth out rough edges:
  - o Select the Smooth Tool (under the Paintbrush Tool).
  - Hold Alt and drag over bumpy areas as needed.



- 6. To remove unwanted inner shapes:
  - o Double-click the shape until the inner shape is selected.
  - o Press Delete.
- 7. Continue to Page 6.


## Finishing Touches: Size Check and Cut Line Color

Almost there!!


Your sticker might look something like this.




- 1. Check sticker size:
  - o Select the shape.
  - In the Properties panel (top right), check W: and H: values (most stickers are ~2–3 inches).
  - To resize, select both the shape and image, then drag a corner handle or enter new values.
- 2. Remove fill color:
  - With the shape selected, select the Fill Color square in the right panel.
- 3. Load the cut line color swatch:
  - In the Fill Color panel, click the Swatches Library menu icon (small books icon).
  - Select Other Library.
  - Navigate to Local Disk (C:) →
     Illustrator Swatches folder → select
     Open.
- 4. Apply the bright pink cut line color:
  - In the Swatches panel, select the bright pink (magenta) color swatch.



- o Swap Fill and Stroke:
- In the left toolbar, click the Swap Fill and Stroke arrow icon.
- Your sticker should now have a bright pink outline (cut line) around it.











## Creating Multiples and Saving Your Sticker File

You've got the cut lines!



- 1. Select both the image and cut line:
  - Using the Selection Tool (black arrow), click and drag a box around both the image and the cut line.



 Alternatively: Select the image, hold Shift, then select the cut line.

#### 2. Group the items:

- o In the **Properties** panel (right side), select **Group**.
- o This ensures the image and cut line move together.

#### 3. Duplicate the sticker:

- While holding Alt (Option on Mac), click and drag the grouped sticker to create a copy.
- Repeat as needed to make multiple copies.

### 4. Save your file:

- o Go to File → Save As...
- Choose a location ON YOUR COMPUTER (not the cloud).
- Change the file format to PDF.
- Select Save.
