Biographical Note

Katherine A. Spilde, PhD, is a cultural anthropologist who specializes in the social, economic, and political impact of casino gaming on American Indian tribal governments and communities in the United States. Dr. Spilde starting investigating the impacts of tribal government gaming in 1994 when she started ethnographic fieldwork in her hometown of Mahanomen, Minnesota. That work became the foundation of her PhD dissertation, “Acts of Sovereignty, Acts of Identity: Negotiating Interdependence through Tribal Government Gaming on the White Earth Indian Reservation,” at the University of California, Santa Cruz in 1998.

After completing her PhD, Dr. Spilde worked as a policy analyst and report writer for the National Gambling Impact Study Commission (NGISC), which sought to identify the social and economic impacts of gambling in the United States, including those stemming from tribal government-owned gaming enterprises. After the NGISC released its Final Report in 1999, she worked as the Director of Research for the National Indian Gaming Association (NIGA), where she established national research initiatives, created economic development and tribal gaming policy platforms, and established the open-source National Indian Gaming Library and Resource Center. In 2001, Dr. Spilde left her position at NIGA to work as a Senior Research Associate for the Harvard Project on American Indian Economic Development, which focuses on identifying social and economic impacts of gaming on American Indian communities. In 2000, Dr. Spilde was appointed to the Board of the National Council on Problem Gaming, a Washington DC organization that develops national policy and assistance programs for people affected by problem gambling.

In 2004, Dr. Spilde became the Executive Director for the Center for California Native Nations at the University of California, Riverside (UCR), organizing and overseeing the first state-level impact study of tribal government gaming in California. Since 2008, Dr. Spilde has been an associate professor in the School of Hospitality and Tourism Management at San Diego State University, where she created the nation’s first four-year degree in Tribal Casino Operations Management. She also serves as the Endowed Chair of the Sycuan Institute on Tribal Gaming. In 2016, Dr. Spilde was appointed to the Board of the

National Center for Responsible Gaming, a nonprofit that funds research about pathological and youth gambling in the US.

The collection contains documentation on a number of Native American nations, including the Misi-zaaga'iganiing Anishinaabeg (Minnesota Chippewa Tribe, Mille Lacs Band); Gaa-waabaabiganikaag Anishinaabeg (Minnesota Chippewa Tribe, White Earth Band); Forest County Bodéwadmi (Forest County Potawatomi Community); Ho-Chunk Nation of Wisconsin; Mashantucket Pequot Indian Tribe; Mohegan Tribe of Indians; Tulalip Tribes of Washington; Sisseton-Wahpeton Oyate of the Lake Traverse Reservation; Standing Rock Sioux Tribe of North and South Dakota; Mandan, Hidatsa, and Sahnish (Arikara) (Three Affiliated Tribes of the Fort Berthold Reservation, North Dakota); and Mississippi Band of Choctaw Indians. Other communities are also represented in the collection but to a lesser extent. The collection documents regional and national trends in Native American gaming, and the greater gaming industry in the United States and internationally. Materials trace federal and state relationships with individual Native American nations, specifically concerning gaming enterprises.

Materials were donated in 2013 and 2016 by Katherine Spilde; accession numbers 2013-028 and 2016-001.

Processing Note

The collection was minimally processed by Tom Sommer in 2014 at the time of accessioning. In 2016, as part of the National Historical Publications and Records Commission grant-funded project "America's Great Gamble," Hannah Robinson, Lee Hanover, and Hana Gutierrez processed, arranged, and described the materials. The biographical note was written by Dr. Katherine Spilde.

In all cases, the names of federally recognized Native American nations used in the finding aid were taken from the "Indian Entities Recognized and Eligible To Receive Services From the United States Bureau of Indian Affairs" compiled by the Bureau of Indian Affairs in the 2016 edition of the *Federal Register*. However, when autonyms and native language names were available, they were placed before the *Federal Register* name. Outdated *Federal Register* names were also listed if the current *Federal Register* name had been edited or changed significantly by the government. For non-federally recognized nations, the name found on the primary document in the collection or the name found on the group's website was used. Canadian First Nations names were drawn from the "Aboriginal Affairs and Northern Development Canada" website.

Scope and Contents Note

The regional subject files include materials collected by anthropologist Katherine Spilde about Native American gaming, Native American communities in the United States, and the US and international gaming industries. The materials date from 1859 to 2015, with the bulk of materials dating from 1990 to 2010. Materials dating from the nineteenth and early twentieth centuries are a reproduction of a federal treaty and an ethnohistorical essay. The majority of the materials document Native American gaming following the passage of the 1988 Indian Gaming Regulatory Act. The papers include research and subject files created by Dr. Spilde during her employment with the National Gambling Impact Study Commission (NGISC), National Indian Gaming Association (NIGA), and Harvard Project on American Indian Economic Development (HPAIED). The materials document Native American gaming enterprises both on and off reservations, the socioeconomic impact of gaming, the political history of gaming in the US, and international gaming. The series includes socioeconomic reports, testimonies, correspondence, memos, press releases, photographs, audiovisual materials, promotional materials, brochures, fact sheets, summaries, booklets, pamphlets, advertisements, tourism materials, journal articles, legal briefs, legislative documents, court opinions, notes, presentations, conference materials, periodicals, community newspapers, and newspaper articles.

The collection contains documentation on a number of Native American nations, including the Misi-zaaga'iganiing Anishinaabeg (Minnesota Chippewa Tribe, Mille Lacs Band); Gaa-waabaabiganikaag Anishinaabeg (Minnesota Chippewa Tribe, White Earth Band); Forest County Bodéwadmi (Forest County Potawatomi Community); Ho-Chunk Nation of Wisconsin; Mashantucket Pequot Indian Tribe; Mohegan Tribe of Indians; Tulalip Tribes of Washington; Sisseton-Wahpeton Oyate of the Lake Traverse Reservation; Standing Rock Sioux Tribe of North and South Dakota; Mandan, Hidatsa, and Sahnish (Arikara) (Three Affiliated Tribes of the Fort Berthold Reservation, North Dakota); and Mississippi Band of Choctaw Indians. In addition to materials about gaming and casinos, Dr. Spilde also collected documents, photographs, and audiovisual materials about Native American culture in general. The series documents regional and national trends in Native American gaming, and the greater gaming industry. Materials trace federal and state relationships with individual Native American nations, specifically concerning gaming enterprises.

Arrangement

The series is arranged using a common approach that categorizes Native American communities based on geographic boundaries. This regional organization is useful in this context because many of the materials deal with documents from Native American groups, state agencies, and federal departments. Further, the regional arrangement provides easier placement of Native American nations that reside in more than one state. Materials about specific Native American nations are generally placed in the state and region where their reservation is currently located. However, since many Native American communities were subject to removal policies that displaced them from their ancestral homes, information about a community may be found in more than one region. For example, researchers interested in the Oneida nations will want to consult both the Northeast, for the Oneida Nation of New York, and Great Lakes, for the Oneida Nation located in Wisconsin.

Within each regional subseries, materials are sorted by state. In cases where a nation's territory occupies areas of two or more states, the folder label is based on the region (i.e. the folder will be labeled "Plains: Sisseton-Wahpeton Oyate"). The subseries are arranged alphabetically by state with general folders about the state placed first in a rough chronological order, and with nation-specific folders following in alphabetical order. The materials are further arranged chronologically by date.

Scope and Contents Note

The Alaska subject files include materials about the Native Village of Barrow Iñupiat Traditional Government, the Native Village of Venetie Tribal Government, and state-tribal relationships dating from approximately 1993 to 2001. The materials include reports, informational booklets and packets, memos, newspaper articles, and pamphlets. Although there are some chronological gaps in this subseries, and the materials only cover a small number of the Native American communities in Alaska, the materials provide a snapshot of the political stance of the state of Alaska toward indigenous communities at the time.

Arrangement

General materials about the state of Alaska are first, and materials about individual Native American nations are next. The materials are further arranged in a rough chronological order within each folder.

Scope and Contents Note

The California subject files include materials about California Native American communities and documents gaming and non-gaming topics (1908, 1974-2013). Materials include socioeconomic reports, tribal constitutions and amendments, tribal-state gaming compacts, informational booklets, Dr. Spilde's photographs from research trips, court opinions, correspondence, video recordings of televised programs, promotional materials, newspaper articles, Native American

community periodicals, and books about indigenous culture. The California subject files document various Native American communities, Native American culture and politics, and the regulation of gaming in California.

Arrangement

General materials about the State of California are first, and materials about individual Native American nations are next, arranged in alphabetical order. The materials are further arranged in a rough chronological order. The folders containing newspaper articles are roughly arranged in chronological order, and the newspaper articles in each folder remain in original order by topic.

Scope and Contents Note

The Northwest Coast regional subject files include materials about Native American communities and gaming in Washington and Oregon (1859, 1970, 1985-2007). The materials include socioeconomic reports, tribal-state gaming compacts, gaming ordinances, journal articles, court opinions, Dr. Spilde's research photographs, newsletters, informational packets, promotional materials, materials on fishing rights, press releases, video recordings of televised programs, memos, and newspaper articles.

The Northwest Coast subject files focus primarily on Native American gaming and non-gaming topics in Washington State, but also covers the same issues to a lesser extent in Oregon. The materials document a number of Native American nations, particularly the Tulalip Tribes of Washington. The subject files contain materials about Native American community issues such as gaming, sovereignty, and hunting and fishing rights. Additional information about Northwest Coast Native Americans can be found in the Columbia Plateau subject files.

Materials that concern regional topics are placed first. Then materials are arranged alphabetically by state. Within each state, materials about general state topics are first in chronological order and materials about individual Native American nations follow in alphabetical order. Scope and Contents Note

The Plains regional subject files include materials about Native American communities and gaming in Iowa, Kansas, Missouri, Montana, Nebraska, North Dakota, Oklahoma, South Dakota, and Texas dating from approximately 1988 to 2008.
