Biographical Note

Civil engineer George W. Malone was born in Fredonia, Kansas in 1890. As a young man he moved to Reno, Nevada and worked as a civil and hydraulic engineer while attending the University of Nevada, Reno. Malone graduated from college in 1917, and he enlisted in the military when the United States entered World War One. At first he served in the artillery, but he eventually became a regimental intelligence officer and served in England and France until 1919. After leaving the Army he returned to Nevada and worked in the engineering field. He served as the State Engineer of Nevada from 1927 to 1935. During World War Two Malone worked for the United States Senate as an engineering consultant on war materials. He was elected in Nevada to the United States Senate in 1946 and served until 1959. After serving in the Senate he remained in Washington, D.C. as a consulting engineer.

George W. Malone passed away in 1961 and is buried in Arlington Cemetery.
