## Historical Note

---

The First National Bank of Nevada was initially chartered under the name Farmers and Merchants National Bank of Reno in 1903. Over the course of several decades they incorporated a number of other Nevada banks into their operations. In 2008, the bank was closed by the Office of the Comptroller of the Currency (OCC) and the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation (FDIC) was named as the receiver. In that capacity they entered into a purchase and assumption agreement with Mutual of Omaha Bank, Omaha, Nebraska, to take over all of the deposits and certain assets.

## Scope and Contents Note

---

The Nevada Banking History Collection appears to have been compiled by the First National Bank of Nevada. It contains correspondence, checks, deposit slips, and other documents related to early bank operations in Nevada. There are also newspaper articles, published materials and photographs relating to the history of banks in Nevada from 1870 to 1976. The collection also includes materials about Senator Patrick A. McCarran of Nevada and E.J. Questa, President of First National Bank of Nevada. Notable subjects documented in the collection include bank robberies committed in Nevada by Butch Cassidy and the Wild Bunch, photographs of the crash site of the streamliner *City of San Francisco* in 1939 near Carlin, Nevada, and photographs of the cast of the *Bonanza* TV series at a First National Bank event, and officials and branches of the First National Bank of Nevada.
