# **Biographical Note**

Omer C. Stewart and Martha C. Knack wrote a book together in 1984 titled *As Long as the River Shall Run: An Ethnohistory of Pyramid Lake Indian Reservation*. Stewart (1908-1991) was Professor Emeritus of the Department of Anthropology at the University of Colorado in Boulder, Colorado and a renowned scholar of indigenous religions, particularly peyotism. He was also an outspoken advocate for the indigenous nations of the United States. Martha Knack began teaching in the Department of Anthropology at the University of Nevada Las Vegas in 1977 and is the author of numerous books and articles on the Northern and Southern Paiute.

# **Scope and Contents Note**

The Omer C. Stewart and Martha C. Knack Collection on the Pyramid Lake Northern Paiute People and Reservation is comprised of materials collected by Stewart and Knack as research for their 1984 book, *As Long as the River Shall Run: An Ethnohistory of Pyramid Lake Indian Reservation*. The collection focuses on the Pyramid Lake Indian Reservation in Northeastern Nevada from 1831 to 1975. The materials document the change in Northern Paiute land ownership, subsistence patterns, access to resources, and cultural traditions after contact with Americans. Furthermore, the materials contain documented pieces of indigenous resistance, including documentation from a court case over disputed water rights.
