Hoggard then discusses his involvement with the National Association for the Advancement of Colored People (NAACP), including serving as chapter president for four years. Other topics that Hoggard recalls in the interview are his work as director for the Economic Opportunity Board in Clark County, Nevada, involvement in the Las Vegas Human Relations Committee, working with the West Side Federal Credit Union, and running the American Association of Retired Persons' (AARP) Tax Aid Program.
